2010 Inductee into the Kansas Hall of Fame for Meritorious Service

George was involved in Kansas ASA as Player, Team Manager, Commissioner, Umpire, and Umpire Supervisor.

He worked as a carpet salesman at Star Lumber and Kansas Building Supply.

As a Manager and pitcher in 1972 his slow pitch team, **Triton Oil**, won State and finished second in the National Tournament at Jacksonville FL. In 1973 he won State again and played in Nationals. Some of the Kansas Hall of Fame members that played for George was Dave Obholz, Doug Majher, Ron Soft, and Larry Berger.

After his playing days he served as Umpire Supervisor for the City of Wichita and the Wichita Church League.

George helped organize qualifying and State Tournaments, served as Tournament Director and District Commissioner for Chuck Davenport, State Commissioner Retired and Dale Wilson, State Umpire-In-Chief Retired. Other notable people that George worked with or assisted were Kenny Squires, Bob Waterson, and Mario Narvaes.
